The Center for Design Thinking is a central hub supporting the growth and implementation of design thinking across the Manhattanville campus. These skills are best applied to tackling real, complex, and unscripted problems that have no known solutions, also known as "wicked problems." Through curricular and co-curricular activities, students have opportunities to experience and practice the process and mindsets of design thinking. Innovative programs and initiatives:

The SOM offers M.D. degrees and graduate medical education residency and fellowship programs, the GSBMS grants Ph.D. and M.S., the SHSP offers M.S., M.P.H., Dr. P.H., D.P.T. degrees as well as certificate programs, TCDM confers D.D.S degrees and the nursing program is a R.N. to B.S. degree program.

The BSM Program is part of the Professional Science Master's (PSM) initiative designed to provide workforce-oriented master's degrees in the fields of science and mathematics. The SHSP offers M.P.H. degrees in environmental health science, health policy and management, health behavior and community health, and epidemiology, a Doctor of Physical therapy (D.P.T) degree as well as M.S. degrees in biostatistics, speech-language pathology and bioethics which addresses the ethical dilemmas in health care likely to remain on the forefront for the foreseeable future with an increased demand for bioethics professionals. Classes are scheduled in the evening to accommodate working students and are available online. The Center for Disaster Medicine in the SHSP conducts interdisciplinary research, training, technical assistance, and educational activities related to emergency preparedness for disasters, terrorism and public health emergencies.

Innovative Programs and Initiatives:
